Cyber risks related to data loss and data breach is well understood. The same cannot be said for physical damage caused by cyber.

Our seminar focuses on physical damage and consequential losses such as business interruption arising from a cyber event. We will discuss 'silent' cyber cover, the pitfalls of the current endorsements and exclusions and up-to-date alternatives bringing more certainty to all parties - adopting a clear cyber exclusion can be a basis for a clear 'bolt-on' tailor made cyber coverage or stand-alone products.

Cyber risks in industrial property are increasing and exposures are complex. Insurers have already paid for physical damage initiated by a cyber event, even if they may not realise it. All risks policies cover physical damage caused by cyber unless expressly excluded, so there is a real risk of 'silent' insurance cover.
